Membership Requirements

***Regular Membership** in the Society for Developmental and Behavioral Pediatrics is open to all doctoral level professionals committed to scientific inquiry, teaching, and/or clinical excellence in developmental and behavioral pediatrics as it affects the health care of infants, children, and adolescents. The 2008 dues are \$200 US.

***Associate Membership** is available to trainees, professionals without a doctoral degree and developing world professionals. The 2008 dues are \$110 US.

Trainees include those currently enrolled in a degree-granting program, post-doctoral fellows in developmental-behavioral fields, and applicants who completed such training within the previous two years. Professionals without doctoral degrees include nurse practitioners, occupational and physical therapists, speech/language pathologists, social workers, and others who contribute to developmental-behavioral pediatrics.
